Volunteers Needed as Food Bank Switches to Summer Hours

Every summer, The Food Bank sees a decrease in volunteers. This year, we need people to help break that trend so we can continue our operation without issues. To make that possible, the **Volunteer Room** will be adjusting hours to be open on Mondays and serve earlier on Saturdays. And **Central Pantry** is introducing a new volunteer shift!
